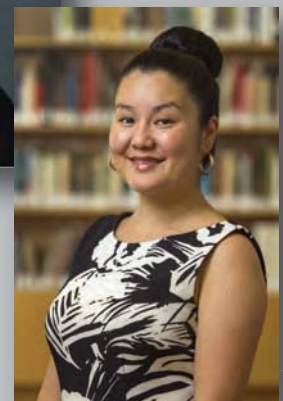
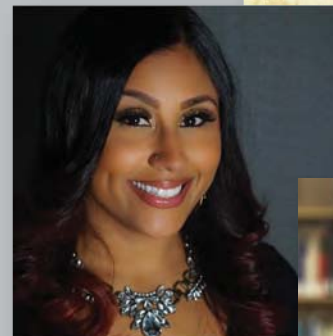

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The CESJ Business Meeting will feature a Radical Healing Session facilitated by Dr. Shawn Ginwright, Farima Pour-Khorshid, and Christina Villarreal. This session will explore a new movement of healing justice essential to facilitate efforts of repairing the damage done by the erosion of hope resulting from structural violence in urban communities. Efforts to promote personal and collective liberation requires a self-conscious process that allow individuals to challenge the personal and structural barriers by drawing upon the strengths of one’s history and cultural connection. This workshop will provide participants with an opportunity to learn about and actively engage in activities based on the five principles of the Radical Healing framework: CARMA: Culture, Identity, Agency, Relationships, Meaning, and Aspirations (Ginwright, 2015).

An Interview on Revolutionary Mentoring with Dr. Sealey-Ruiz

How do you define revolutionary mentoring?

In *The Fire Next Time*, James Baldwin wrote "Love takes off the masks that we fear we cannot live without and know we cannot live within." I define revolutionary mentoring as an act of love. For me, revolutionary mentoring also means to be honest, at all times, about where we find ourselves, and not be afraid to talk about our fears and do our best to face and overcome them.

What practices do you employ in your mentorship?

I try to listen carefully and be generous with what I know. I also like to take an inquiry stance in my mentoring and ask a lot of questions.

What advice would you give to faculty regarding mentorship?

First, I would recommend that faculty make sure they offer it! Second, I would say to them "never forget." Sometimes, the further away we are from our pre-tenure years, the easier it is to forget what it was like, and how confusing and vulnerable the road to tenure can be. I would advise faculty who are mentoring others to be generous with time and patience, and seek to guide mentees toward a path of solving issues for themselves in practical and critical ways.
